The HOA Board of Directors met on November 3, 2015 at President Pennye Epperly's house. All four board members were present and the meeting started at 6:00 p.m.

The first order of business was to ascertain the Christmas Open House date and place. Second order was regarding the HOA packet with the details and requirements of our HOA for new home buyers. Penney will send the documents to Brian, who will then put them all into one PDF file for convenience when we need them. Real estate agents should express to their buyers that they are signing Covenants and to look them over before signing.

Thirdly, Brian handed out a book to all from Chadwick, Washington, Moriarty, Elmore and Bunn, regarding the Virginia Statutes for Property Owners Associations. It was discussed that our present attorneys in Rocky Mount do not specialize in homeowner association laws. Brian suggested we go with the group above as that is their specialty and they offer additional help and discounts. The difference in cost goes from \$150 to \$300 for the new group. The BOD will plan a walk around sometime in the Spring to assess any damage to common areas due to the Winter weather, i.e. fallen limbs and trees, pot holes, and erosion along street edges. We also want to ensure compliance with our Covenants and Restrictions, which are in place to help protect and maintain property values. All property owners will be notified in advance of the walk around.
